Tips for Successful Art Projects

These tips will ensure that your art project looks great on our products.

Paper and Proportions


You can use any **SIZE** paper. However, the **shape** of the paper is important!



Our products are designed around **letter-sized proportions**. So square, tall-skinny, or wide-short art does not fit well.



Ideal sizes of paper: 4.25" x 5.5", **8.5" x 11**", 11" x 14", 17" x 22".








Colour and Mediums

Simple, bold and colourful art always turns out well.

The best mediums include:

- Paint
- Oil pastels
- Markers
- Charcoal and chalk
- Collage





Stay away from pencil crayon! It comes out faint and dull.

Remind your artists <u>not to draw important</u> <u>details near the edge of the paper</u>, or it may be cropped during printing.



Things to Avoid

Googly eyes - they capture reflections when the art is photographed and digitized. Try "eye stickers" instead.



- Pencil crayon it comes out disappointingly faint and dull.
- Square, tall-skinny, wide-short art our products are designed around letter-sized proportions.
- All things **fluorescent**, including paints, paper and markers. The colours don't reproduce well.
- Please do not seal the art with shiny, glossy products.

Choosing a Theme



Parents are proud to share their children's art with family and friends.

When deciding on a theme for the art project, think: "Would I use products made with this art?"

Most themes are very successful, but **NOT self-portraits or Halloween-themed art.**



Borders





Please do not mount or "frame" the art.

In most cases, the art presents best on our products without a border.

However, if you would really like a border added to your class' art, please email me and I will digitally add a border.
